Let's talk grouping

Interior designers group accessories to reinforce their chosen style.

HOW TO ARRANGE YOUR ACCESSORIES...

Do you love looking at home magazines and interiors books? I love turning to them for inspiration and ideas.

One of my favourite things is to gather all my ornaments onto the kitchen table, mixing wood, glass, metal, objects in all shapes and sizes. I sort to size, tall, short, hard, soft, glossy, and rough textures.

So now you have your collection of objects find the space for your "new" arrangement.

Think triangles, such as the vases on the left-hand side, third shelf down on the image.

Place the tallest ornaments in the centre and arrange smaller ornaments on either—side, forming a triangle shape. It does not have to be perfectly symmetrical; varying heights add visual interest.

Consistent colour schemes will make the display look visual pleasing and cohesive. You can also mix and match with colours from your room.

Working with odd numbers, 3, 5 or 7 is aesthetically pleasing to the eye and creates a great dynamic.

Make sure your objects overlap, hiding a little of each object creating unity. The below image from our website is a great example of this.



Tried & Tested Methods for your finishing touches.

No strict rules!

So your basic furnishings are in place, but how do you bring it all together and make your room feel conhesive and welcoming.

Firstly, what draws you into the room?

Clever, interesting details will provide the mood for your room and ignite curiosity to make you want to see more.



This statement matt black mirror, with concave metalwork frame is as much wall art as it is a mirror.

Ok so now you are in the room, what's making you want to stay?

May be a comfortable armchair, with squashy cushions and your favourite throws. What is the thing that makes you feel relaxed and wonderfully cosy?

Framing, looking upwards what makes you drink in the whole room?

It may be a stunning lamp, striking wall art or a large house plant. This makes you notice the full room and acts as framing.

So, where's a great place to show your arrangements.

Let us look at the entrance to your home. A suitable place for a grouping is before you step in the front door, space allowing. (outdoor) plants of different heights and coordinated pots make a great first impression.

Into your hallway. If you have space, position a console table, with statement artwork either fixed to the wall or leaning, a lamp for ambient lighting and accessories will make your hallway really welcoming to guests.





If you do not have room for a console table, then shelving like the image below also works very well.



When selling your home, the general advice is to put away your personal items, this is so prospective buyers can imagine their own life in your house. Not so when you are living in it though! Bring together your favourite pieces, whether hobbies or memorable items from your travels. Your objects need to give you positive vibes.

I love an inviting guest room and cloak/bathroom. A lit candle, flowers and pretty perfume bottles displayed with fresh white towels and a boxed bar of fine soap will make your guests swoon!



Arrangements in the kitchen can be effective, making use of spices, chopping boards, utensils etc which are also practical and used most days!

I've a real favourite though, where space allows, I try to add accessory displays, e.g. a champagne bucket or gorgeous cut flowers and fruit displayed.



To round up!


- 1. Show off your personal collections! You can make displays to be so eye catching in your home. Get them out of the cupboards!
- 2. Use distinct levels and in varying heights and shapes using 3,5,7s rather than pairs or even numbers. Remember to use triangular shapes.
- 3. Remember to overlap them for maximum effect.
- **4.** Layers and depth create in front, middle and behind display.
